Respiratory Therapy Program at SAIT (Calgary): Training seats available to qualified Saskatchewan students. Seats are reserved for Saskatchewan students—The Ministry of Advanced Education invites you to help inform Saskatchewan students of the Respiratory Therapy program at the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT) in Calgary. Respiratory therapy is a diverse and specialized profession that assists physicians in diagnosing, treating and managing patients with issues that impact the heart and lungs. They work with patients of all ages in hospitals, long-term care or home care settings. The Ministry of Health and Saskatchewan Health Authority have identified Respiratory Therapy as an in-demand occupation, meaning graduates have strong career prospects right here at home. Saskatchewan has an agreement with SAIT to reserve seats for eligible Saskatchewan students in the Respiratory Therapy program. Respiratory Therapy students participate in a comprehensive three-year diploma program consisting of classroom, lab, study, clinical simulation and practicum rotations. Students complete their clinical training in Saskatchewan and are eligible for various Government of Saskatchewan financial supports including student loans and grants.
