

# Required / Elective Courses

- ➤ Required courses are mandated by the Ministry of Education- all students must take them. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have these. If you have been unsuccessful OR not taken a required course, you must sign up for this next year
- ➤ **Elective** courses are not required and are selected by each individual student based on what is offered
- ➤ Both Required and Elective courses count towards your 24 credits needed to graduate
- ➤ LAS/EAL Tutorial classes do not count towards your 24 credits

# NOTE:

#### GRADE 10 COURSES are labelled as '10'.

E.g. One of the Grade 10 English courses is ELA10.

#### GRADE 11 COURSES are labelled as '20'.

E.g. One of the Grade 11 Math courses is MWA20.

#### GRADE 12 COURSES are labelled as '30'.

E.g. The Grade 12 History course is HIS30.

#### ANY COURSE ENDING IN A '1' is a MODIFIED course.

E.g. MATH 11, HSC21, ELA21
