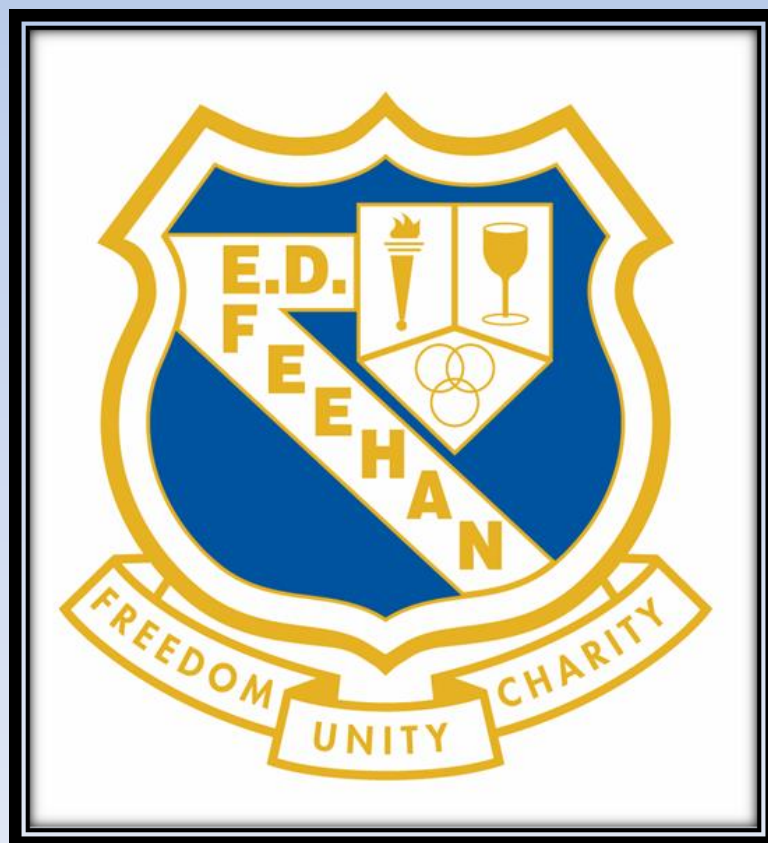

Required / Elective Courses

- **Required** courses are mandated by the Ministry of Education- all students must take them. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have these. If you have been unsuccessful OR not taken a required course, you must sign up for this next year
- **Elective** courses are not required and are selected by each individual student based on what is offered
- **Both Required and Elective courses count** towards your 24 credits needed to graduate
- LAS/EAL Tutorial classes do not count towards your 24 credits

NOTE:

GRADE 10 COURSES are labelled as '10'.

E.g. One of the Grade 10 English courses is ELA10.

GRADE 11 COURSES are labelled as '20'.

E.g. One of the Grade 11 Math courses is MWA20.

GRADE 12 COURSES are labelled as '30'.

E.g. The Grade 12 History course is HIS30.

ANY COURSE ENDING IN A '1' is a MODIFIED course.

E.g. MATH 11, HSC21, ELA21

Stretch Math is designed for a student who find the subject difficult, but works hard and completes homework

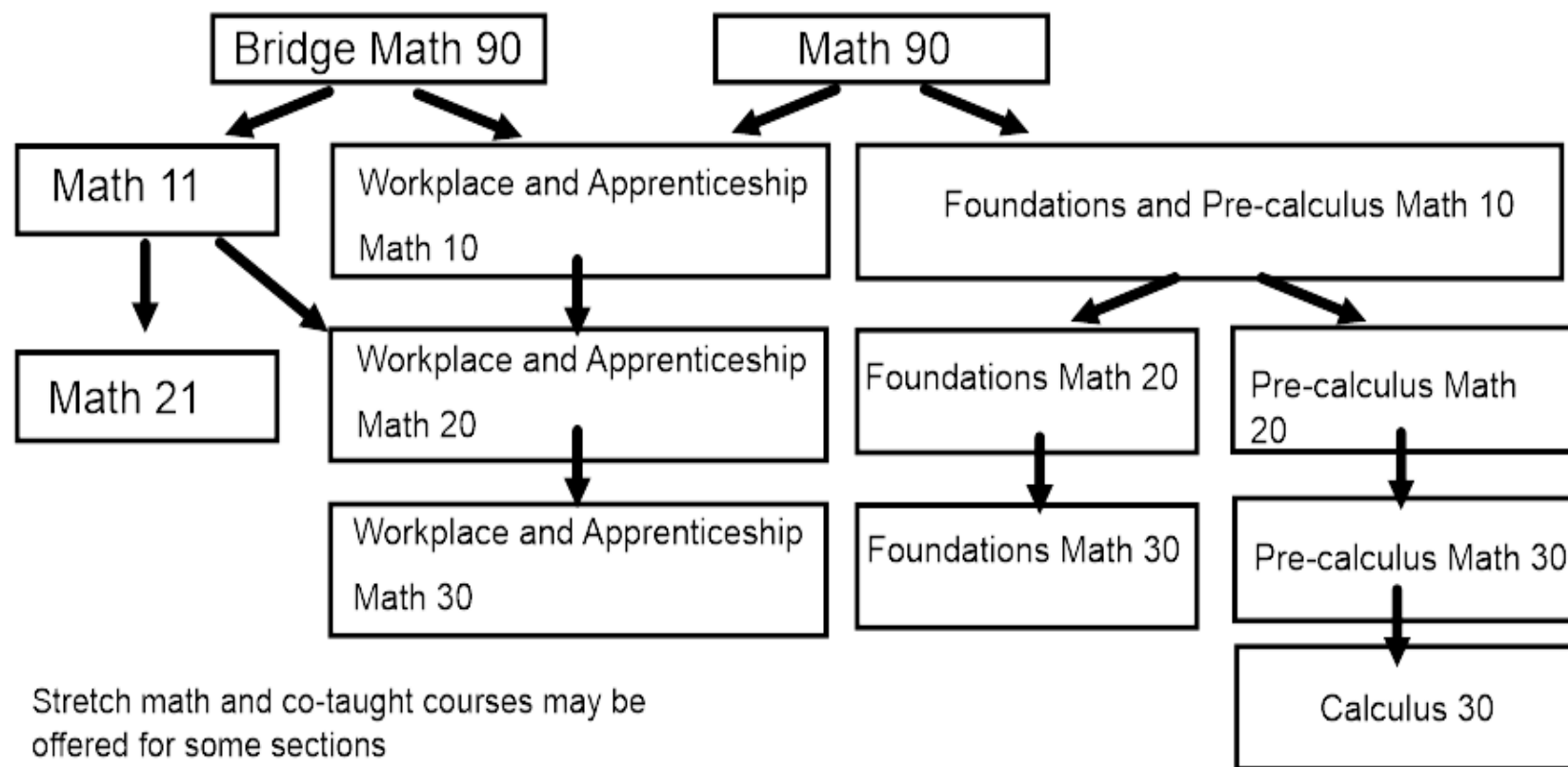

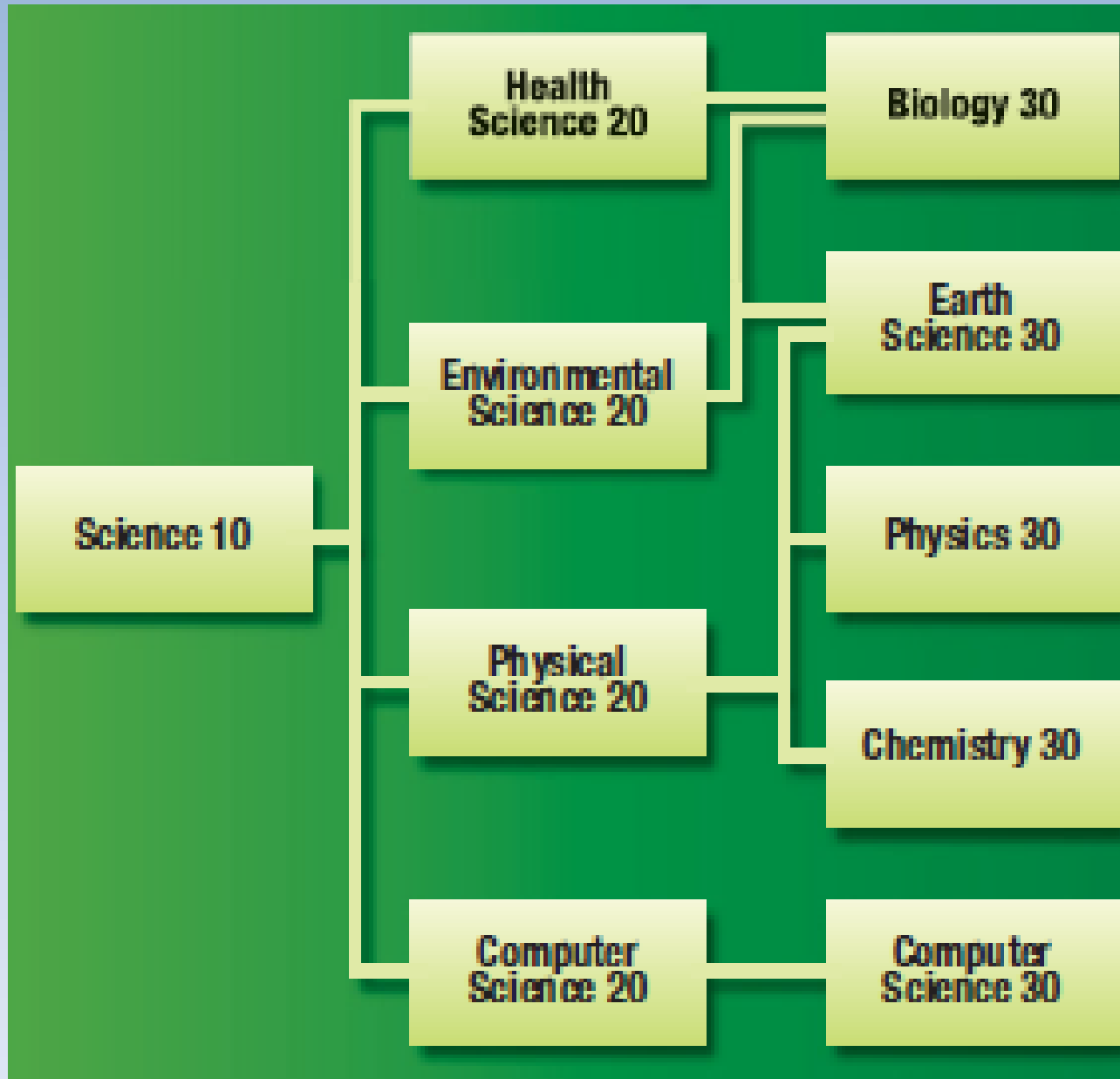

This program will focus on integrating Indigenous culture, ways of knowing, spirituality, extra supports, and land-based learning opportunities into the courses.


