Q & A:

- David: Last year, the grade 8 class developed a project funded through the Sask Watershed Authority, and the classroom won some money. Unsure if the money ever came through to the classroom.
- Other classes have done projects with the Meewasin as well. Darren reached out to the Meewasin they are having funding issues which makes it a challenge to provide opportunities to work with an interpreter in the grasslands. But they are working on projects/education that involve QR codes that can be accessed in the grasslands.
- Crystal: Her son does not stay at the school for lunch, so does not have to pay for supervision. However, for hot lunch he will stay for lunch (2 times per month). Is he allowed to stay for lunch? Darren says that this is not being strictly enforced, and he won't nickel and dime families. Krista says there are student activity fees in high school, unsure why not in elementary. Apparently they ran in to problems, because of equity and challenges with charging families in core neighbourhoods.
