#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

### O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!

This week we will formally begin the celebration of Advent. For the next three weeks leading up to the Christmas break, we will rejoice in the great gift that is ours in Jesus Christ. To help us celebrate, each week during our Advent liturgy, we will be lighting the candles of the Advent wreath. The candles signify that Jesus is the Light of the World. The evergreens remind us that He is life and brings life to us. All these are arranged in a circle because life in Christ has no end. Each week we will light another candle. Then, when we are back to school after the Christmas holidays, we will light all of the candles, including the center one, the Christ candle. As we do, we will rejoice that Christ has come to us. He is Emmanuel... God with us.

On this first week, we light the candle of HOPE. Hope is our assurance that God will finish all He has started. Hope is our confidence that He will do all He has promised. All the promises of God are fulfilled in Jesus Christ. He is our hope, today and forever! (2 Corinthians 1:20) The second candle on our advent wreath represents "peace". Peace is one of God's gifts to us. John the Baptist was a prophet calling the people of Israel to repent, to find peace with God. During our third celebration, we will light the pink "joy" candle. This candle helps to remind us of the joy and delight because of Jesus' birth. The last candle represents "love". "For God so loved the world that he gave His one and only Son," (John 3:16). During this Christmas and throughout the year, I wish each and every family hope, peace, joy and love. Have a blessed Christmas!
