PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

During the month of February, our morning prayers and reflection will be focused on the gospel virtue of courage. Our message for staff and students will be emphasizing the inner strength and wisdom that God provides to guide our actions for social justice, peace and service. We hope to inspire our students to act with courage by loving others, advocating for equality, and reaching out to transform or make a difference in the world.

Extra-curricular activities remain on pause at the present time. Basketball and indoor track practices will be cancelled for the month of February.

During the next few weeks of February, we will be celebrating Black History Month. Teachers have been provided resources that include videos, stories, and prompt questions to learn more about Black history within our province and the prairies.

The Lenten season will begin the first week of March. Our first liturgy is scheduled for Ash Wednesday on March 2nd with the hope of distributing ashes within our school environment. We will celebrate Lent with classrooms leading online liturgies and more information will be provided to families once our celebration schedule is established during the months of March and April.

As part of our Lenten almsgiving, we are going to Pool Our Love in support of the Saskatoon Friendship Inn! The Inn services up to 1000 meals daily, 365 days of the year to help feed the hungry in Saskatoon and relies on the generosity of communities. Our school will be collecting **identified food items** beginning Monday, February 28th and concluding Wednesday, March 16th. A large "paddling pool" will be located at the front of the school (unfortunately, students will only have the opportunity to view our school-wide collection on their way to the gym) and we thank all families for their anticipated generosity to support those in need within our city. Kindergarten to grade 2 classes are asked to donate **pancake mix**, grade 2/3 to grade 5/6 are asked to bring

rice or quick oats, and grade 6 to grade 8 classes are asked to donate **syrup**. Students can bring donated items to their classroom teacher for collection. We will follow Covid safety protocols and guidelines for storage and delivery.

With Valentine's Day taking place Monday, February 14th, our school will be permitting the exchange of Valentine's cards. Unfortunately, food or candy items that are traditional during this time are not permitted.

Our annual Parent Kindergarten Information Night is scheduled for Wednesday, March 2nd at 7:00 in our gym if we are permitted to gather in person. Parents are asked to contact the school by phone to register for the evening presentation and guided tours. If we are not permitted to meet in person, parents will have the opportunity to take part in an online virtual presentation. We are slowly receiving registrations for next year. Please encourage any neighbors and parents who may be considering the English stream or French Immersion at St. Mother Teresa to contact the school at their earliest convenience if they have questions regarding our programs or registration procedures. Children must be five years of age by January 31, 2023 to begin kindergarten in the fall.

French Education Week will take place the week of February 14th and students will have the opportunity to participate in several online French cultural activities provided by French Cultural Council and the French Society of Saskatchewan. We are hoping the weather will cooperate for Carnaval (outdoor winter festival scheduled for Tuesday, February 15th and Wednesday, February 16th) so that students can enjoy the several activities that include land skis, snowshoes, gunny sack races, cross-country skiing, and tug-o-war contests. Our Hope Club is organizing an Art Showcase during French Education Week. Students in Kindergarten to grade 4 will have the opportunity to submit colored pieces of art work and grade 5 to grade 8 students are asked to submit sticky note art. Details have been provided to classroom teachers and students. We look forward to seeing the work of our aspiring artists!

St. Mother Teresa will organize and publish a school yearbook this year. The cost is **\$23.00** and it will contain several theme and classroom pictures, but will be slightly different from previous editions with the cancellation of so many extra-curricular activities. It is our hope that this will provide a wonderful memory for kindergarten to grade 8 students and parents during a very unique school year. The next Three-Way Conferences are scheduled on Thursday, March 17th (evening) and Friday, March 18th (morning). We are awaiting an update regarding the status of in-person or virtual conference formats and will provide this information as soon as possible.
