PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

During the month of March, our school community will be reflecting on the gospel virtue of reconciliation. Staff and students will have the opportunity to think about the love we share for one another when we ask and offer forgiveness, and how reconciliation leads us to an understanding of our own actions, words and thoughts. It is our hope that our students and staff grow in relationship to God through prayer, fasting (refraining from a daily activity or doing something to help), and almsgiving (donations).

The Lenten season is upon us and we are preparing our hearts for God's greatest act of love for us – the death and resurrection of His son, Jesus. Classrooms will be leading bi-weekly liturgies and prayer services as the Easter season continues in the coming weeks. As part of our traditional almsgiving, St. Mother Teresa is collecting syrup (Grade 6-8 classrooms), rice or quick oats (Grade 2/3 to Grade 5/6 classrooms), and pancake mix (Kindergarten to Grade 2 classrooms) for The Friendship Inn in our "Pool of Love" which is located at the front of the school. Please be generous as our food collection will conclude Thursday, March 17th. Thank you for your anticipated support as we help to feed those who are hungry in our community.

This week, we celebrate Ash Wednesday with a liturgy led by Grade 7 Daigneau. Bishop Hagemoen will be joining us for our virtual liturgy at 12:45. Classroom led liturgies are scheduled on March 16th (Grade 2/3 Ronellenfitsch) and March 30th (Grade 5/6 Miljkovic). All classrooms will visit our Stations of the Cross on April 13th and 14th.

Progress reports and three-way conferences are quickly approaching. Three Way Conferences are scheduled for Thursday, March 17th in the evening from 3:45 to 8:00, and Friday, March 18th during the morning from 8:30 to 12:30. Parents will receive an invite to schedule their conference time next week and they will take place in-

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person at the school. Parents and/or students who wish to wear masks are certainly encouraged to do so. If parents wish to schedule a virtual three-way conference, please contact your child's classroom teacher directly by email or Edsby after you have scheduled your time.

Portfolios will be sent home on Tuesday, March 15th. It is extremely important for parents to review material that is provided in the portfolio with their children as this is an informative resource for parents to direct discussions during three-way conferences. Portfolios will contain examples of student work that indicate areas of strength and growth. This is an opportunity for parents to discuss learning goals from the initial conference in November with their children as they prepare for dialogue with classroom teachers in term two. Parents will be able to view their child's Progress Report on Friday, March 25th.

The St. Mother Teresa Yearbook ordering information has been sent out to all families by broadcast (School Messenger). This will be a wonderful memory for your children as it will contain pictures of individual classrooms, extra-curricular activities, as well as pictures of classroom and large group school activities. The yearbooks cost \$23.00 and can be ordered online.

Grade 8 boys and girls will have the opportunity to play basketball during the next three weeks. Although there is not a schedule with neighboring schools as the season was cancelled due to Covid guidelines, we are providing an intramural format with school-based teams playing each other during the noon hour break.

FRENCH IMMERSION GRADE CONFIGURATION FEEDBACK – FATHER ROBINSON SCHOOL

As was shared on February 15th, 2022, the GSCS Board of Education has decided to designate Father Robinson School as a dual stream school starting in the fall of 2022. One of the key takeaways from the parent feedback is that a gradual implementation of grades would best support the growth of this new program. The new immersion program will grow to become a Kindergarten to grade 8 program that will serve the areas of Willowgrove, Sutherland, Forest Grove, Arbor Creek and Erindale. For the fall of 2022 we will be focusing on the primary grades. Families with children who will be in Kindergarten to grade 4 in the fall of 2022 are invited to fill out the <u>French Immersion Grade Configuration Intent Survey</u>. The survey is intended to gather preliminary information regarding possible grade configurations. Please note that this survey is not intended to be a formal registration. Formal registration will take place once grade offerings are determined in the spring.
