IFBF HIV/AIDS

### **Statement of Policy**

Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools are committed to maintaining a healthy and safe environment for all students, families, and employees. HIV/AIDS education shall be delivered in a manner consistent with Catholic Church teaching.

#### Rationale

Every effort must be made to ensure the safe inclusion of students and staff who are HIV-positive.

HIV/AIDS infection is a serious health issue in the Province of Saskatchewan and education can play an important role in the prevention and spread of the disease.

### Procedures/Guidelines

- 1. If HIV status is disclosed, all staff members who are so informed shall maintain absolute confidentiality.
- 2. HIV infection shall not prevent a person from being employed or working in a school setting.
- No child who is HIV-positive shall be isolated from school or classroom.
  Circumstances which may require accommodations will be guided by health care professionals.
- 4. Classroom instruction regarding HIV/AIDS will be provided to students in Health classes as indicated in Provincial Health Curriculum.
- 5. Lessons regarding HIV/AIDS shall be taught according to the "SCSBA Catholic HIV/AIDS Program" (October 2020) as approved by the Catholic Bishops of Saskatchewan (September 2020.)
  - a. All additional resources or materials used in instruction on HIV/AIDS must be consistent with Catholic Church teaching.
