- Second order of clothing will be placed next Thursday
  - more of a spirit fundraiser and not making a lot of money
- Hot lunches going well
  - Lunches will be posted up until Easter
  - Earn approximately \$600 per lunch with minimal work
  - So far experiencing good relationships with restaurants involved
  - Looking for a replacement for Julie who organizes the hot lunches
    - Next year will be her last
  - Question around whether some kids are not purchasing hot lunches due to lack of funds
    - Discussion around being able to support some kids occasionally with a hot lunch
    - Connie will look into which students may be in need
    - Profits would be able to support this
- Moms Pantry fundraiser is on
  - o current gross sales are over \$2000
  - Ends on Tuesday

### **Deacon Shawn Panio Speaking about the GSCS Foundation**

- Video presentation regarding importance of Catholic education from students' perspective

- Deacon Shawn is originally from SK, and has been in ON where he was a Chaplin for elementary schools
  - Background in business, non-profit, and school leadership
  - Roman and Ukranian Catholic Deacon
  - Here to increase awareness regarding need for funding
- More sense of family, love, and caring within the catholic schools
- Catholic schools get identical funding to public schools for education
- Costs 2 million dollars for Saskatoon Catholic School division to pay for faith based education which does not come from taxes
  - Funding from taxes does not cover religious education program, chaplains, bussing costs from masses, food and nutrition programs
  - Number of fundraising events help cover costs and staff are encouraged to contribute monthly donations
    - Ex with Schools Win Twice fundraiser, a portion of the resources comes back to the schools to purchase items, pay for bussing to mass, fund student and staff retreats, as well as rosary clubs
- Mandate is to raise \$2 million every year
  - Goal is to achieve this through monthly giving
    - Need 4000 monthly donors at \$30/month in order to cover costs
  - If 2 million is raised, schools are free to focus on other issues
    - More freedom to enhance faith based education and offload costs
- Trying to figure out how to get the message out about the need for funding
  - Will include newsletter blurbs and social media
    - Facebook page is GSCS Foundation
  - Will be speaking in churches
